On 1 April 2013, the Croydon Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) came into force. CIL is a charge which local authorities can levy on most types of new development.

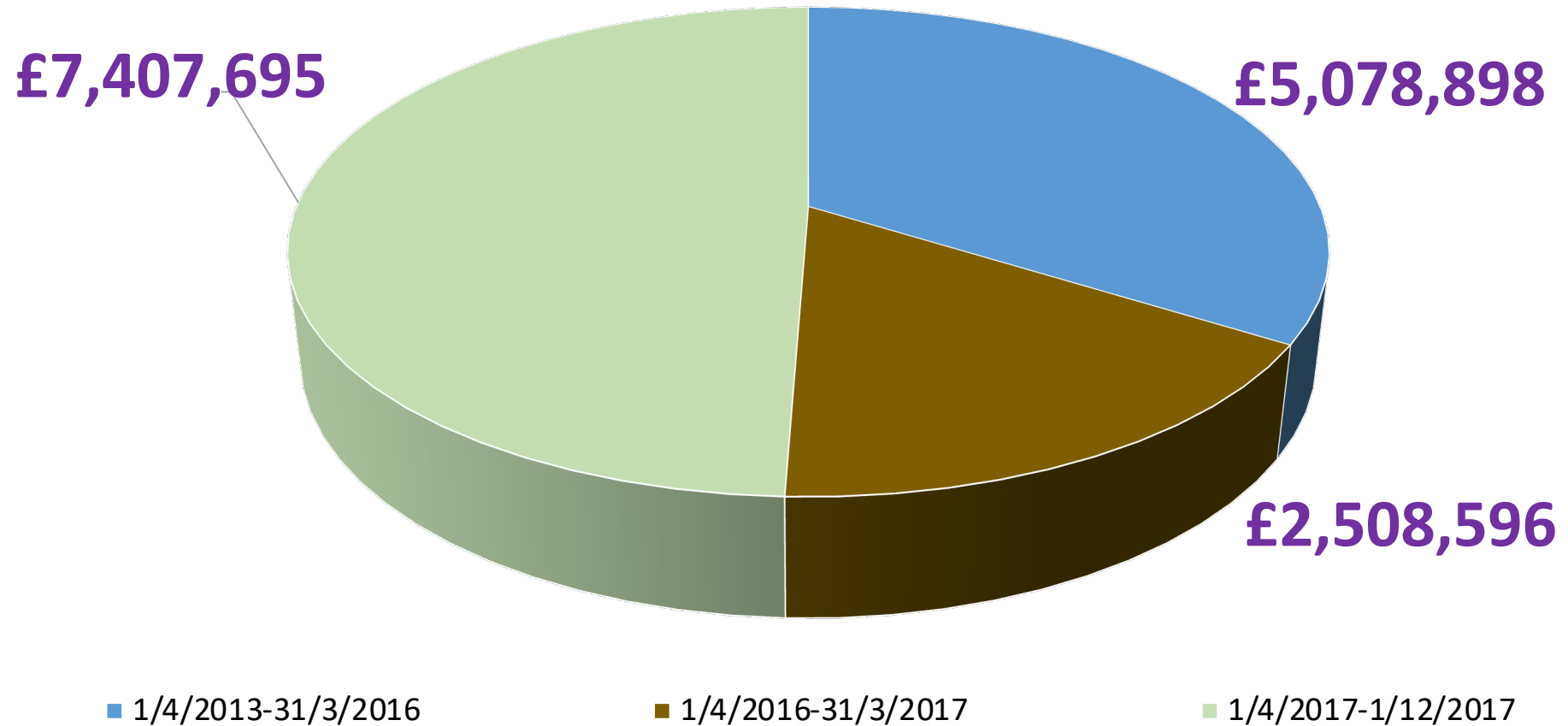
£14,995,189 has been collected from inception to 1/12/2017.

Of the total collected **34%** was from inception to 31/3/2016 totaling **£5,078,898**

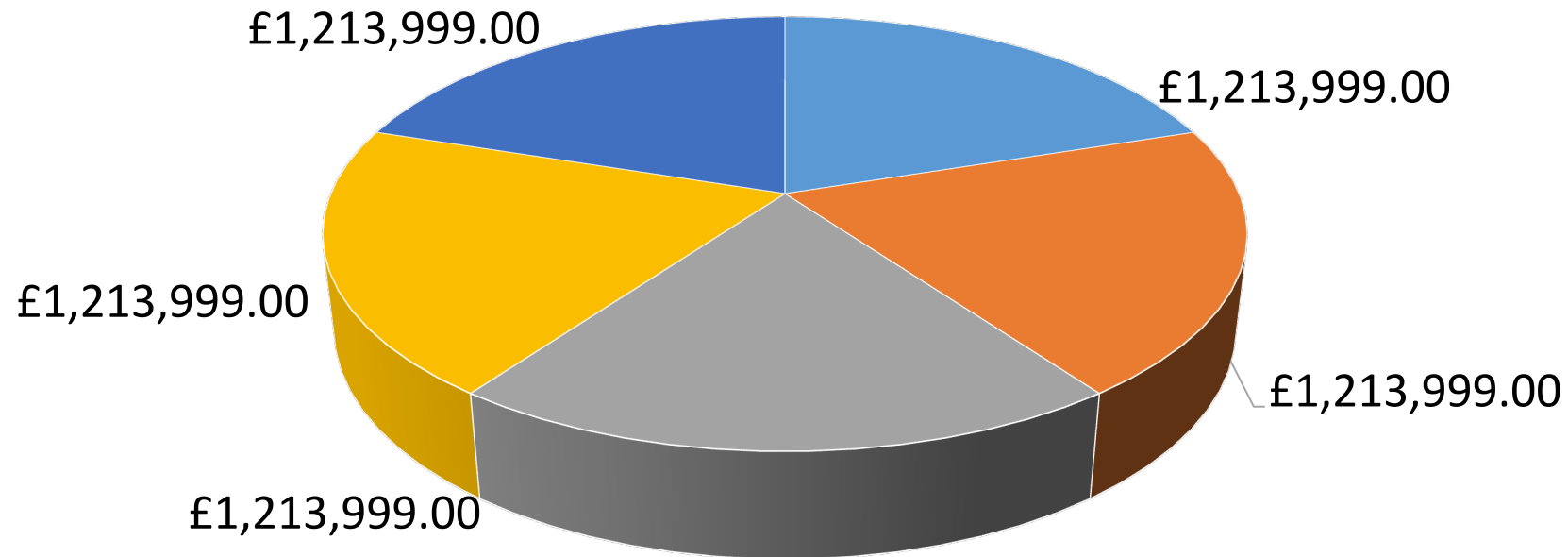
Of the total collected **17%** was from 1/4/2016 to 31/3/2017 totalling **£2,508,596**

It is interesting to note that **49%** of the total collected was between 1/4/2017 and 1/12/2017, **£7,407,695**
