Croydon Local Plan

The Local Plan is used to determine planning applications. There is review of the Local Plan underway and further changes were needed following the appointment in May 2022 of the Executive Mayor, Jason Perry and subsequent approval of his Business Plan (2022-2026). The updated version of the revised Local Plan now takes account of the Mayor's Business Plan and addresses concerns raised on the previous 'Regulation 19' (which took place January-February 2022).

The revised Local Plan has been approved for publication at the Cabinet Meeting on 27 March 2024. It was subsequently approved at the Full Council meeting on 17 April 2024 for submission to the Secretary of State for independent examination (following the conclusion of the statutory Regulation 19 publication). The consultation material is currently being prepared and will be launched in June for a 6 week consultation period. Representations (in accordance with Regulation 19 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004) will soon be invited.

Housing Needs and Homelessness Procurement Team

Housing Needs has set up a new procurement team with the aim of procuring further accommodation to meet the demand from our homeless residents. (Accommodation includes B&B's, longer-term Temporary Accommodation, and private rented sector units).

The service would like to develop a strong relationship with private sector landlords, local managing and lettings agents and owners of empty properties to secure use of privately rented properties for households in housing. The service will help:

- Negotiate, prepare, sign off lease/management agreements with various providers for different schemes.
- To agree all property rates and prices.
- To ensure all properties acquired meet the HHSRS Housing Standards.
- To conduct regular inspections with accommodation providers.

Waste Management and Recycling

The Council offers weekly and Biweekly collections on General Waste and Recycling. Estates and blocks of flats with more than 5 homes usually have communal bin sheds, general waste is collected weekly.

26% of properties (c.109,000) receive the communal collection service. This is where a household shares large bins with many neighbouring properties. These bins are usually located in a communal bin store. The service is designed for purpose-built flats and larger blocks of converted flats.

15% of properties (c.63,000) receive the shared bin kerbside collection service. This is where a household shares standard-sized wheelie bins and recycling boxes with a small number of neighbours (typically no more than six). The service is designed for houses that have been converted into flats, houses of multiple occupation (HMOs) and smaller blocks of purpose-built flats, where there isn't room for larger communal bins.

For sites with 5 or more units need to hire bins through the Council or purchase directly via a third party for general waste. Please contact the team at hirebins@croydon.gov.uk for further information.

Managing agents/developers/owners of new builds and conversions need to purchase or hire the bins from the council or a third party. Please contact the team newbuildbins@croydon.gov.uk for further information.
