## PN68 - CROYDON COUNCIL PROPOSED INTRODUCTION OF NEW NEIGHBOURHOOD CARE BAY MAYFIELD ROAD, SOUTH CROYDON

The Croydon (On-Street Charged-For Parking Places) (No. K14) Order 20-The Croydon (Prohibition and Restriction of Stopping, Loading and Waiting) and (Free Parking Places) (No.K15) Order 20-

- 1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Croydon Council proposes to make the above Traffic Orders under the relevant sections of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended and all other enabling powers.
- 2. The general effect of the Orders would be:
- (a) To introduce a Neighbourhood Care Parking Bay outside a new children's home at No. 12 Mayfield Road, South Croydon. The parking place would be in operation 'at any time' throughout the week and the use of the parking place would be restricted to passenger vehicles displaying a Neighbourhood Care permit issued by the Council.
- (b) To amend the map-based tiles to the Schedule attached to the above Orders to accurately represent the new parking arrangements as they exist on site.
- 3. A copy of the proposed Orders and all related documents can be inspected until the last day of a period of six weeks beginning with the date on which the Orders are made or, as the case may be, the Council decides not to make the Orders, by appointment with the Parking Design Team, at Bernard Weatherill House, 8 Mint Walk, Croydon, CR0 1EA (telephone 020 8726 6000 and ask for Parking Design). - 4. Persons desiring to object or make representations in relation to the proposed Orders should send a statement in writing of their objection and the grounds thereof to the Order Making Section, Parking Design Team, Place Department, Croydon Council, Floor 3, Zone C, Bernard Weatherill House, 8 Mint Walk, Croydon CR0 1EA or email Parking Design (address above) quoting the reference PD/CH/K14 & K15 by 11 July 2024.
- 5. The proposed Orders are intended to introduce a new Neighbourhood Care parking bay to provide parking facilities for a new children's home and ensure transport is available for daily trips to and from school and other essential journeys.
