THE BRIDLE ROAD & THE SOUTH BORDER, PURLEY

TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC

- 1. Croydon Council HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that to facilitate gas works by SGN, they intend to make an Order the effect of which would be to temporarily prohibit traffic movements in The Bridle Road and The South Border, Purley.
- 2. Whilst the said works are taking place:
- a) The Bridle Road will be closed at its junction with Foxley Lane.
- b) The South Border will be closed at its junction with Foxley Lane.
- c) Vehicles proceeding in Foxley Lane will be banned from turning into The Bridle Road and The South Border.
- 3. During the closure the diversion routes for vehicular traffic will be as detailed below. Access will be maintained for residents.
- The Bridle Road closure: Diversion via Woodcote Drive, Peaks Hill, Plough Lane, Foxley Lane, and Plough Lane.
- The South Border closure: Diversion via Foxley Lane, Woodcote Lane, Rose Walk, Foxley Lane, and Furze Lane.
- 4. The Order will come into operation on 22 July 2024, and it is anticipated that the works will be completed on 02 September 2024. However, the Order will remain in force for 18 months to be reintroduced should further work be required. The prohibitions will only apply during such times and to such extents as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
- 5. These restrictions shall not apply in respect of:
 - (a) any vehicle involved in carrying out the said work.
 - (b) any vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance, or police purposes.
 - (c) anything done with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer.
