NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Croydon Council on 19 August 2024 made the above Traffic Orders under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended and all other enabling powers.

1. The general effect of the Orders will be to:

a) Designate new parking places at which vehicles displaying a disabled persons' badge may be

left without charge or time limit in the following locations.

Beechwood Avenue, Thornton	Outside No. 39
Heath	
Dunsfold Way, New Addington	One metre north-east of the footpath access to Nos. 245 to 261
Montpelier Road, Purley	Immediately to the north of the existing disabled bay adjacent to the footpath leading to Nos. 59 to 65 Montpelier Road.
Parchmore Road, Thornton Heath	Outside No. 96 and partially across the frontage of No. 94

- b) Amend the map-based tiles to the Schedule attached to the above Orders to accurately represent the new parking arrangements as they exist on site.
- 2. Copies of the Orders, which will come into operation on 26 August 2024, and of all associated Orders can be inspected between 9am and 4pm, Monday to Friday inclusive, until the last day of a period of six weeks beginning with the date on which the Orders are made by appointment with the Parking Design Team, at Bernard Weatherill House, 8 Mint Walk, Croydon, CR0 1EA (telephone 020 8726 6000 and ask for Parking Design). Any person desiring to question the validity of the Orders or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984 or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made there under have not been complied with in relation to the Orders may, within six weeks of the date on which the Orders were made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
