Change your relationship with plastic this holiday season to help reduce your carbon footprint.

Did you know?



Plastic is made from oil, a fossil fuel that contains carbon stored from plants and animals that lived millions of years ago. This fossil carbon is released into the atmosphere when your rubbish is treated, which contributes to climate change.



Plastic waste probably makes up around **16%** of the weight of your rubbish bin, but accounts for **70%** of your bin's carbon footprint.

It takes **75%** less energy to make a plastic bottle using recycled plastic compared to newly made plastic.

So, that's why keeping plastic out of your rubbish bin is a really simple and effective way to cut your carbon footprint. "I buy a plasticfree advent

calendar".



"I steer clear of plastic artificial Christmas trees - I prefer a real one from a certified 'Grown in Britain supplier'".
