- 3. During the work, the alternative routes for traffic will be as detailed below.
- Rowdown Crescent closure Via King Henry's Drive, Rowdown Crescent.
- Windham Avenue closure Via King Henry's Drive, Calley Down Crescent, Windham Avenue.
- Stowell Avenue closure Via Calley Down Crescent, Windham Avenue.
- 4. The Order will come into operation on 03 February 2025, and it is anticipated that the work will be completed as detailed above. However, the Order will remain in force for a maximum duration of 18 months to be reintroduced if further work is required.
- 5. These restrictions shall not apply in respect of:
 - a vehicle being used to conduct the said work.
 - a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance, or police purposes, or the purposes of a statutory undertaker in an emergency, such as the loss of supplies of gas, electricity or water to premises in the area. which necessitates the bringing of vehicles into a section of road to which the order applies.
 - anything done with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer.
