LANSDOWNNE ROAD, CROYDON

TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF VEHICULAR TRAFFIC & PARKING

1. Croydon Council HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that to facilitate works to telecommunication masts, they intend to make an Order the effect of which would be to temporarily prohibit traffic movements and parking in Lansdownne Road, Croydon.
2. During the work:
 - a) Lansdownne Road will be closed between its junction with Bedford Place and No. 79 Lansdownne Road.
 - b) Parking bays opposite No. 75 Lansdownne Road will be suspended.
3. Whilst the closure remains in force the alternative routes for diverted traffic will be as detailed below.
 - From Bedford Place: via Lansdownne Road, Sydenham Road, Gladstone Road, Gloucester Road, and A222.
 - From A222 Windmill Bridge: via A222, Sydenham Road, and Bedford Place.
 - From A222 St James's Road: via A222 Windmill Bridge, Lower Addiscombe Road, Cherry Orchard Road, Addiscombe Grove, Barclay Road, Park Lane, Wellesley Road, Bedford Park, and Bedford Place.
4. The Order will come into operation on 01 May 2025, and it is anticipated that the work will be completed within one day. However, the Order will remain in force for 18 months to be reintroduced should further work be required. The prohibitions will only apply during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
5. The restrictions shall not apply in respect of:
 - (a) any vehicle involved in conducting the said work.
 - (b) a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance, or police purposes, or the purposes of a statutory undertaker in an emergency, such as the loss of supplies of gas, electricity or water to premises in the area, which necessitates the bringing of vehicles into a section of road to which the order applies.
 - (c) anything done with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer.
