ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT, 1984, SECTION 14
AS AMENDED AND THE ROAD TRAFFIC (TEMPORARY RESTRICTIONS) ACT
1991

SOUTHWOOD AVENUE & JULIEN ROAD, COULSDON
TEMPORARY RESTRICTION OF TRAFFIC & PARKING

1. Croydon Council HEREBY GIVES NOTICE that to facilitate gas main replacement work by SGN, they have made an Order the effect of which would be to temporarily restrict traffic and parking in Southwood Avenue and Julien Road, Coulsdon.
2. Whilst the said works are taking place:
 - a) The entire length of Southwood Avenue will be closed from 12 May to 19 May 2025.
 - b) The entire length of Julien Road will be closed from 19 May to 26 May 2025.
 - c) Parking in Southwood Avenue will be suspended on the even-numbered side of the road outside Nos. 2 to 28 during the above closure.
 - d) Parking in Julien Road will be suspended on the even-numbered side of the road from the junction with Woodmansterne Road to No. 14 Julien Road during the above closure.
3. Whilst the closures are in place the diversion routes for traffic will be as detailed below.
 - Southwood Avenue closure – via Woodmansterne Road, Bramley Avenue & vice versa, or via Woodmansterne Road, Julien Road, Bramley Avenue & vice versa.
 - Julien Road closure – via Woodmansterne Road, Southwood Avenue, Bramley Avenue, & vice versa, or via Woodmansterne Road, Woodcote Grove Road, Bramley Avenue & vice versa.
4. The Order will come into operation on 12 May 2025, and it is anticipated that the work will be completed on 26 May 2025. However, the Order will remain in force for 18 months to be reintroduced should further work be required.
5. These restrictions shall not apply in respect of:
 - (a) any vehicle involved in carrying out the said works.
 - (b) a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance, or police purposes, or the purposes of a statutory undertaker in an emergency, such as the loss of supplies of gas, electricity or water to premises in the area, which necessitates the bringing of vehicles into a section of road to which the order applies.
 - (c) anything done with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer.
