TEMPORARY RESTRICTION OF TRAFFIC & PARKING

- 1. Croydon Council HEREBY GIVES NOTICE that to facilitate gas main replacement works, they have made an Order the effect of which would be to temporarily restrict traffic and parking on the above roads.
- Whilst the said works are taking place, the roads/sections of roads below will be closed and/or subject to parking suspensions/no waiting and loading restrictions at any time, as detailed.

- 3. Whilst the closures are in place the diversion routes for traffic will be as detailed below.
 - Allenby Avenue Closure Eastbound traffic on Allenby Avenue via Grange Road, Brantwood Road, Braemar Avenue and vice versa. Northbound traffic on Grange Road via Grange Road, Brantwood Road, Braemar Avenue and vice versa. Southbound traffic on Grange Road pre diverted via Brantwood Road, Braemar Avenue and vice versa.
 - Grange Road Closure eastbound on Brantwood Road pre-diverted via Brantwood Road, Brighton Road, Allenby Avenue, Grange Road and vice versa. Westbound on Brantwood Road via Brantwood Road, Brighton Road, Allenby Avenue, Grange Road. and vice versa. Northbound traffic on Grange Road pre diverted via Allenby Avenue, Brighton Road and Brantwood Road.
- 4. The Order will come into operation on 18 August 2025, and it is anticipated that the work will be completed on approximately 15 September 2025. However, the Order will remain in force for 18 months to be reintroduced should further work be required.
- 5. These restrictions shall not apply in respect of:
 - (a) any vehicle involved in conducting the said works.
 - (b) a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance, or police purposes, or the purposes of a statutory undertaker in an emergency, such as the loss of supplies of gas, electricity or water to premises in the area, which necessitates the bringing of vehicles into a section of road to which the order applies.
 - (c) anything done with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer.
