## PN228 - CROYDON COUNCIL ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT, 1984, SECTION 14

## AS AMENDED AND THE ROAD TRAFFIC (TEMPORARY RESTRICTIONS) ACT 1991

## ASHBURTON AVENUE, GLENTHORNE AVENUE & SHIRLEY ROAD, CROYDON - TEMPORARY RESTRICTION OF TRAFFIC & PARKING

- 1. Croydon Council HEREBY GIVES NOTICE that to facilitate works to install a new water connection on behalf of Thames Water, they intend to make an Order the effect of which would be to temporarily restrict traffic and parking in Ashburton Avenue, Glenthorne Avenue and Shirley Road.
- 2. Whilst the said works are taking place:
- a) Ashburton Avenue will be closed between its junction with Shirley Road and a point 20 metres southwest of that junction.
- b) Glenthorne Avenue will be closed between its junction with Shirley Road and a point 20 metres north-east of that junction.
- c) Parking will be suspended and waiting and loading restrictions will apply at any time in the following locations.
  - (i) Ashburton Avenue between its junction with Shirley Road and a point 20 metres south-west of that junction.
  - (ii) Glenthorne Avenue between its junction with Shirley Road and a point 20 metres north-east of that junction.
  - (iii) Shirley Road on both sides of the road outside and opposite Nos. 106 to 114.
  - (iv) Shirley Road on both sides of the road outside and opposite Nos. 94 to 104.
- d) The south-western footway of Shirley Road will be closed outside No. 106.
- 3. During the closures, the alternative routes for vehicular traffic will be as detailed below. Pedestrians affected by the footway closure will be directed to a walkway in the carriageway.
- Via Glenthorne Avenue, Blackthorne Avenue, Shirley Park Road, Shirley Road and reversed.
- Via Ashburton Avenue, Craven Road, Bingham Road, Shirley Road and reversed
- Via Shirley Road, Green Court Avenue, Craigen Avenue, Ashburton Avenue and reversed.
- 4. The Order will come into operation on 09 October 2025, and it is anticipated that the works will be completed in three days. However, the Order will remain in force for 18 months to be reintroduced should further work be required.
- 5. These restrictions shall not apply in respect of:
  - (a) a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance, or police purposes, or the purposes of a statutory undertaker in an emergency, such as the loss of supplies of gas, electricity or water to premises in the area, which necessitates the bringing of vehicles into a section of road to which the order applies.
  - (b) anything done with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer.
  - (c) any vehicle involved in carrying out the specified works.
