

PN369 - CROYDON COUNCIL
ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT, 1984, SECTION 14 AS AMENDED
THE ROAD TRAFFIC (TEMPORARY RESTRICTIONS) ACT 1991 AND ALL OTHER
ENABLING POWERS
NOTTINGHAM ROAD & WHITGIFT AVENUE, SOUTH CROYDON
TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF VEHICULAR TRAFFIC & PARKING

1. Croydon Council HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that to facilitate cable installation works by UKPN, they intend to make an Order the effect of which will be to temporarily prohibit traffic movements and parking in Nottingham Road and Whitgift Avenue, South Croydon.
2. Whilst the said works are taking place:
 - a) Nottingham Road will be closed northbound (towards Warham Road) between its junctions with Brighton Road and Warham Road.
 - b) Whitgift Avenue will be closed at its junction with Nottingham Road.
 - c) Parking in Nottingham Road will be suspended and waiting and loading restrictions will apply “at any time” between its junctions with Warham Road and Brighton Road.
 - d) Parking in Whitgift Avenue will be suspended and waiting and loading restrictions will apply “at any time” between its junction with Nottingham Road and a point 20 metres south-west of that junction.
3. During the closures the alternative routes for vehicular traffic will be as detailed below.
 - Diversion for Nottingham Road: Brighton Road and Warham Road.
 - Diversion for Whitgift Avenue: Haling Park Road, Warham Road and Nottingham Road.
4. The Order will come into operation on 29 January 2026, and it is anticipated that the work will be completed on 22 March 2026. However, the Order will remain in force for 18 months to be reintroduced should further work be required.
5. These restrictions shall not apply in respect of:
 - (a) a vehicle involved in carrying out the said works.
 - (b) a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance, or police purposes, or the purposes of a statutory undertaker in an emergency, such as the loss of supplies of gas, electricity or water to premises in the area, which necessitates the bringing of vehicles into a section of road to which the order applies.
 - (c) anything done with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer.
