ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT, 1984, SECTION 14 AS AMENDED
THE ROAD TRAFFIC (TEMPORARY RESTRICTIONS) ACT 1991 AND ALL OTHER
ENABLING POWERS
HILLSIDE ROAD AND VIOLET LANE, CROYDON
TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC & PARKING

1. Croydon Council HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that to facilitate ducting excavation works on behalf of UKPN, they have made an Order the effect of which will be to temporarily prohibit vehicular traffic movements and parking in Hillside Road and Violet Lane, Croydon.
2. Whilst the said works are taking place:
 - a) Hillside Road will be closed between its junctions with Cosedge Crescent and Denning Avenue.
 - b) Violet Lane will be closed at its northern and southern junctions with Warham Road/Denning Avenue.
 - c) Parking will be suspended and waiting and loading restrictions will apply at any time on both sides of Hillside Road between its junctions with Cosedge Crescent and Denning Avenue.
 - d) Parking will be suspended and waiting and loading restrictions will apply at any time on both sides of Violet Lane for 20 metres north and 20 metres south of its junctions with Warham Road/Denning Avenue.
3. During the closures the alternative routes for traffic will be as detailed below.
 - Hillside Road closure - via Price Road, Violet Lane and Denning Avenue.
 - Violet Lane closure, northbound - via Price Road, Hillside Road and Denning Avenue.
 - Violet Lane closure, southbound - via Violet Lane, Violet Gardens and Goodwin Road.
4. The Order will come into operation on 22 January 2026, and it is anticipated that the works will be completed in phases within approximately three weeks.
5. These restrictions shall not apply in respect of:
 - (a) a vehicle involved in carrying out the said works.
 - (b) a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance, or police purposes, or the purposes of a statutory undertaker in an emergency, such as the loss of supplies of gas, electricity or water to premises in the area, which necessitates the bringing of vehicles into a section of road to which the order applies.
 - (c) anything done with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer.
