ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT, 1984, SECTION 14 AS AMENDED
THE ROAD TRAFFIC (TEMPORARY RESTRICTIONS) ACT 1991
AND ALL OTHER ENABLING POWERS

THE DRIVE & THE GROVE, COULSDON
TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF TRAFFIC & PARKING

1. Croydon Council HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that to facilitate gas main replacement works, they intend to make an Order the effect of which would be to temporarily prohibit traffic movements and parking in The Drive and The Grove, Coulsdon.
2. Whilst the said works are taking place:
 - a) The entire length of The Grove will be closed in 150 metre sections, starting at its junction with The Avenue on 09 February 2026, and finishing at its junction with The Wend on 23 February 2026. Parking in The Grove will be suspended and waiting and loading restrictions will apply in 150 metre sections as described above.
 - b) The entire length of The Drive will be closed in 150 metre sections, starting at its junction with The Wend on 23 February 2026, and finishing at its junction with Smitham Downs Road on 05 April 2026. Parking in The Drive will be suspended and waiting and loading restrictions will apply in 150 metre sections as described above.
3. During the works the diversion routes for vehicular traffic will be as detailed below.
 - The Grove closure: via Brighton Road A23, Brighton Road, The Avenue and vice versa.
 - The Drive closure: via Brighton Road A23, Brighton Road, The Grove and vice versa.
4. The Order will come into operation on 09 February 2026, and it is anticipated that the works will be completed as above. However, the Order will remain in force for 18 months to be reintroduced should further work be required. The prohibitions will only apply during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
5. These restrictions shall not apply in respect of:
 - (a) a vehicle involved in carrying out the said works.
 - (b) a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance, or police purposes, or the purposes of a statutory undertaker in an emergency, such as the loss of supplies of gas, electricity or water to premises in the area, which necessitates the bringing of vehicles into a section of road to which the order applies.
 - (c) anything done with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer.
