ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984, SECTION 14 AS AMENDED,  
THE ROAD TRAFFIC (TEMPORARY RESTRICTIONS) ACT 1991 AND ALL  
OTHER ENABLING POWERS  
LINK ROAD BETWEEN FOXLEY LANE & BANSTEAD ROAD,  
& WOODCOTE VALLEY ROAD, PURLEY  
TEMPORARY PROHIBITION OF VEHICULAR TRAFFIC & PARKING

1. Croydon Council HEREBY GIVE NOTICE that to enable gas works by SGN they intend to make an Order the effect of which will be to temporarily prohibit traffic in the link road connecting Foxley Lane and Banstead Road, and prohibit parking in Woodcote Valley Road, Purley.
2. Whilst the said works are taking place:-
  - (a) The short section of Banstead Road opposite No. 35, which runs through the island site at the junction of Banstead Road and Foxley Lane, linking those two roads, will be closed.
  - (b) Parking in the marked parking place outside Rosewood Apartments, No.2 Woodcote Valley Road, will be suspended and waiting and loading restrictions will apply at any time.
3. Whilst the closure is in force, the diversion route for traffic will be via Foxley Lane, The Bridle Road, Plough Lane and Foxley Lane.
4. The Order will come into operation on the 30 March 2026, and it is anticipated that the work will be completed on 24 April 2026. However, the Order will remain in force for 18 months to be reintroduced should further work be required.
5. The prohibitions will only apply during such times and to such extents as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
6. These restrictions shall not apply in respect of:
  - (a) any vehicle involved in conducting the said work.
  - (b) a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance, or police purposes, or the purposes of a statutory undertaker in an emergency, such as the loss of supplies of gas, electricity or water to premises in the area, which necessitates the bringing of vehicles into a section of road to which the order applies.
  - (c) anything done with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer.
