ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT, 1984, SECTION 14

AS AMENDED AND THE ROAD TRAFFIC (TEMPORARY RESTRICTIONS) ACT 1991

SELHURST ROAD, SELHURST NEW ROAD, GLOUCESTER ROAD, DAGNALL PARK & SYDENHAM ROAD, SOUTH NORWOOD & CROYDON - TEMPORARY RESTRICTION OF TRAFFIC

1. Croydon Council HEREBY GIVES NOTICE that to facilitate footway surfacing works, they intend to make an Order the effect of which would be to temporarily restrict traffic in Selhurst Road, Selhurst New Road, Gloucester Road, Dagnall Park and Sydenham Road.
2. Whilst the said works are taking place the sections of road and footway below will be closed from 28 March to 10 April 2026.

3. During the closures, the alternative routes for vehicular traffic will be as detailed below. Pedestrians will be diverted to the opposite footway.
  - Selhurst new Road and Gloucester Road closures - via A212, Northcote Road and reversed or via Gloucester Road, Gladstone Road, Sydenham Road and reversed.
  - Sydenham Road closure – via the above diversion route or via Burdett Road, Northcote Road and reversed.
  - Dagnall Park closure – via Northcote Road and Saxon Road or Selhurst Road and Edith Road.
4. The Order will come into operation on 28 March 2026, and it is anticipated that the works will be completed on 10 April 2026. However, the Order will remain in force for 18 months to be reintroduced should further work be required.
5. These restrictions shall not apply in respect of:
  - (a) a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance, or police purposes, or the purposes of a statutory undertaker in an emergency, such as the loss of supplies of gas, electricity or water to premises in the area, which necessitates the bringing of vehicles into a section of road to which the order applies.
  - (b) anything done with the permission of a police constable in uniform or a Civil Enforcement Officer.
  - (c) any vehicle or person involved in carrying out the specified works.
