**PROPOSED AMENDMENT OF WAITING RESTRICTIONS
MORE CLOSE & RUSSELL HILL, PURLEY**

The Croydon (Prohibition and Restriction of Stopping, Loading and Waiting) and
(Free Parking Places) (No. H6) Order 20-
The Croydon (On-Street Charged-For Parking Places) (No. H7) Order 20-

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that Croydon Council proposes to make the above Traffic Orders under the relevant sections of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended, and all other enabling powers.
2. **The general effect of the Orders would be to amend the existing single yellow line waiting restrictions operating from 1pm to 2pm, Monday to Friday, in the following locations, to double yellow lines operating at any time.**
 - a) **Russell Hill - the south side from a point 10 metres west of the junction with More Close to a point 13 metres east of that junction.**
 - b) **More Close - the east (even numbered) side from its junction with Russell Hill southwards for a distance of 14.5 metres.**
 - c) **More Close - the west (odd numbered) side from its junction with Russell Hill southwards for 66.5 metres.**
3. A copy of the proposed Orders and all related documents can be inspected between 10am and 6pm, at Croydon Central Library, Katharine Street, CR9 1ET, from 26 March 2026 until the last day of a period of six weeks beginning with the date on which the Orders are made, or the Council decides not to make the Orders.
4. Persons desiring to object to the proposed Orders should send a statement in writing of their objection and the grounds thereof to the Parking Design Team, 3rd Floor, Zone 3C, Bernard Weatherill House, 8 Mint Walk, Croydon, CR0 1EA, or email Parking.Design@croydon.gov.uk quoting the reference PD/CH/H6 & H7 by 15 April 2026.
5. The Order is intended to amend existing single yellow line waiting restrictions in Russell Hill and More Close to double yellow lines. The measure is intended to improve safety by providing increased visibility and preventing obstructive parking near the junction.
