**7.5T WEIGHT RESTRICTION - PLOUGH LANE, HIGHFIELD ROAD & SIDE ROADS,
HILLCREST ROAD, RUSSELL HILL, MORE CLOSE & RUSSELL HILL ROAD, PURLEY
THE CROYDON (TRAFFIC MOVEMENT) (NO. 1) TRAFFIC ORDER 2026**

1. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the London Borough of Croydon on 20 April 2026 made the abovementioned Order under Section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984 as amended.
2. The general effect of the Order will be to prohibit vehicles exceeding 7.5 tonnes maximum gross weight from proceeding in the following roads or sections of road.

Road Name	Restriction Location
Atalanta Close	Entire length of road
Ensign Close	Entire length of road
Highfield Road	Entire length of road
Hillcrest Road	Between the borough boundary with Sutton and Highfield Road
Plough Lane	Between Foxley Lane and the borough boundary with Sutton
Russell Hill	Entire length of road
More Close	Entire length of road
Russell Hill Road	Between Purley Way and the northern boundary of Russell Hill Road Day Nursery, No. 45 Russell Hill Road

3. The restriction will not apply to vehicles being used for police, ambulance, or fire service purposes, to vehicles entering the street to load or unload goods, to vehicles being used for the maintenance or improvement of the street or the repair, maintenance or reconstruction of utilities, or to vehicles in the service of the local authority being used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.
4. Copies of the Order, which will come into operation on 27 April 2026, and of all associated Orders, can be inspected between 10am and 6pm, at Croydon Central Library, Katharine Street, CR9 1ET for a period of six weeks from the date the Order was made. Alternatively, all related documents or further information can be requested by email to Parking.Design@croydon.gov.uk.
5. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1984 or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made there under have not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within six weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
