Introduction

On Thursday 7 May 2026 you have the chance to vote for the candidate that you want to be the elected Mayor of Croydon.

The elected Mayor provides leadership and direction for the council and borough. They are accountable for council policy and council services.

The elected Mayor has a mandate to represent the whole borough and will speak on its behalf locally, regionally, nationally and internationally. You can find out more about the Mayor's role in this booklet.

There are 8 candidates standing for election. The candidates will be listed on the ballot paper in alphabetical order. You will be able to vote for one candidate only.

The rules for running a Mayoral election require the Returning Officer to send a copy of this booklet to every person registered to vote in this election. All the candidates were able to choose whether to have their statement included.

The order in which their statements appear in this booklet was determined by the drawing of lots. The content of each statement is the responsibility of the candidate. The views expressed are their own and cannot be attributed to the Returning Officer or Croydon Council.

This booklet also includes information regarding the election, including what identification (ID) you will need to show when you go to your polling station to vote.

On Thursday 7 May 2026, the election of the 70 ward councillors will also take place. You will receive a second (yellow) ballot paper for this election when you vote. You will be able to vote for the number of candidates who represent your local area (ward). You can find more information about the election of councillors in this booklet.

The role of the elected Mayor

The elected Mayor provides leadership and direction to the borough and the council. They have overall responsibility for council policy and the delivery of services.









The elected Mayor has a mandate to represent the whole borough and will speak on its behalf locally, regionally, nationally and internationally. It will be for them to decide how this role will work in practice, within the boundaries set out in the council's constitution.

The Mayor:

- sets priorities and policies. These are delivered by council officers who make operational decisions and work in partnership with other organisations.
- holds all executive powers but may delegate them to the cabinet, cabinet committees, individual cabinet members and officers. One of the Mayor's first decisions on being elected to office will be to decide on a scheme of delegation.
- is involved in the appointment of statutory officers and Corporate Directors. The statutory officers are the Chief Executive (Head of Paid Service), Section 151 Officer (Chief Finance Officer) and Monitoring Officer.
- will promote, uphold and act in accordance with the Seven Principles of Public Life (the Nolan Principles) the Members' Code of Conduct and the Protocol on Staff-Councillor Relations.

The council's constitution sets out the council's decision-making structures and rules.

Who can vote?

To vote in the elections on 7 May, you must be included in the Croydon electoral register on the date of the election. The deadline to register to vote is midnight on 20 April. All registered British, Commonwealth and European Union citizens will be entitled to vote. You must be 18 years of age on or before 7 May 2026.

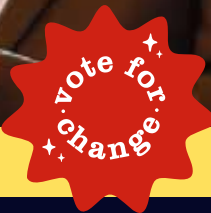

Polling stations

There are 153 polling stations across the borough. Each voter has an allocated polling station (unless they have opted to vote by post).

Poll cards have been sent to every voter with information about the election and where their polling station is located. You do not need the poll card to vote but we encourage you to take it with you when you vote as it will make the process quicker at the polling station.

Please check your poll card carefully. A recent review of the polling districts and polling stations in Croydon resulted in changes to some polling station locations, so it is possible that your polling station in May has changed since the last elections in 2024.

You can also check your polling station online at www.croydon.gov.uk/elections2026 or scan the QR code below.

Polling Stations will be open between **7am and 10pm on Thursday 7 May**.



Accessibility

Standard adjustments are already in place at all polling stations to make voting more accessible. These include:

- Step free wheelchair access
- Low level polling booths
- Audio and tactile devices for blind and partially sighted voters
- Additional polling booth lighting
- Special pencil grips
- Large print versions of ballot papers for reference purposes

If you have a disability you can also be assisted at the polling station by a companion, or by the Presiding Officer.

However, the needs of each individual vary, and additional adjustments may be possible.

If you believe that there are other adjustments that would assist you to cast your vote, please contact electoral services.

Some adjustments may take time to arrange, so we suggest that you contact electoral services as soon as possible on **0300 373 0595** or email electoral.services@croydon.gov.uk

Voter ID

Take your ID with you when you go to vote. You will not be able to vote if you do not have acceptable photo ID.

You only need to show one form of photo ID to vote, but it must be the original version and not a photocopy.

You can use an expired photo ID if you are still recognisable from the photo.

There are many forms of existing photo identification that are accepted. You can use any of the following:

- Passport issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, a British Overseas Territory, an EEA state or a Commonwealth country (including an Irish Passport Card)
- Driving licence issued by the UK, any of the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, or an EEA state (including provisional driving licence)
- Blue badge
- UK government funded travel cards (older person's bus pass, Oyster 60+ card, disabled person's bus pass and freedom pass)
- Identity card bearing the Proof of Age Standards Scheme hologram (a PASS card)
- Biometric immigration document
- Ministry of Defence form 90 (Defence Identity Card)
- National identity card issued by an EEA state
- Anonymous Elector's Document
- HM Armed Forces Veteran Card (MOD form 100)

If you don't have one of these existing accepted forms of identification, you can apply for a new form of photo identification which can be used for the sole purpose of voting in person. This is known as a Voter Authority Certificate.

The deadline to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate is 5pm on Thursday 28 April.

The election of councillors

Croydon is divided into 28 wards. Each ward is represented by either one, two or three councillors as shown in the table on the next page.

The ballot paper will be yellow, and it will confirm at the top of the paper the number of candidates you can vote for. You can vote for as many candidates as there are seats available in your ward.

If you vote for more candidates than the number of available seats, then none of your votes will be counted.
