Decision Title: SEND Post 19 Further Education Programme

Having carefully read and considered the Part A report, and the requirements of the Council's public sector equality duty in relation to the issues detailed in the body of the reports, the Cabinet Member for Children, Young People & Learning in consultation with the Cabinet Member for Finance & Resources

RESOLVED: To

1. Approve the award of contract for Post 19 SEND Further Education (FE) places for young people with an Education Health & Care (EHC) plan to Croydon College for a contract term of two (2) academic years, with the option to extend for a further one (1) academic year, at a maximum contract value of £1,916,568.
2. Note that the Director of Commissioning and Procurement has approved to waive the requirement under Regulation 17 for a procurement strategy, and to

allow the direct award of contract in accordance with Regulation 18 of the Council's Tenders and Contracts Regulations.
