RESOLVED

1. The Cabinet Member for Children, Young People and Learning in consultation with the Cabinet Member for Finance and Resources approved the award of a contract for Supervised Contact for Children in Care and their Families for a term of two (2) years with the option to extend for up to a further 12 months

(maximum of three (3) years) at a maximum total contract value of £1,116,000 to the contractor named in the associated Part B report.
